



## Ask The Right Questions

You've been handed a project. Where do you start? What questions do you ask? We compiled a list of a critical questions to help you get started in your analysis efforts. This checklist is an MS Word form document that can be printed or used electronically as you start eliciting your requirements.

Questions to ask about business processes
<input type="checkbox"/> Why is it done?
<input type="checkbox"/> What does it involve?
<input type="checkbox"/> Who does it?
<input type="checkbox"/> When is it done?
<input type="checkbox"/> How is it currently done? (There may be more than one way.)
<input type="checkbox"/> How might it be done in the future?
<input type="checkbox"/> What constraints affect the process?
Questions to ask about business data
<input type="checkbox"/> Who uses the data?
<input type="checkbox"/> Where does the data originate?
<input type="checkbox"/> Why do we need this data?
<input type="checkbox"/> What is the data?
<input type="checkbox"/> How is the data defined?
<input type="checkbox"/> What are the constraints on the data?
<input type="checkbox"/> When is the data updated?
Questions to ask about business rules
<input type="checkbox"/> How do you make that decision?
<input type="checkbox"/> Is there a minimum or maximum?
<input type="checkbox"/> Are there specific edits?
<input type="checkbox"/> What guidelines are used to make that determination?
<input type="checkbox"/> Are there specific calculations?
<input type="checkbox"/> Are there terms specific to your business?

**Tip!** A quick way to identify business rules is to look for sentences like "If...then", or "Sometimes..." or "In that case..."
